PASTOR'S PEN

Dear Friends,

Bishop Dennis from Africa

I thank all of you who supported the good work of Bishop Dennis who was our annual mission speaker this year. His people live very challenging lives and the religious Sisters and Priests, who help them, are constantly in danger of being shot and killed. This is serious stuff. Child Victims Act

In last week's bulletin Bishop Barres wrote an article explaining the Child Victims Act. If you have not read it, you can find it on our website. It is an important document and should be read by all parishioners.

I would like to say a few words of my own on this subject. Back in 2002, there was a terrible scandal in our Church, when some horrible behaviors from years ago, came to light. This is something we will have to live with for many years to come. Although it disgusts me, and makes me sick, every time I re-read some of these stories, I do want to remind you that the Church has implemented many serious provisions since 2002, and these changes have helped keep our children safe. The two major requirements the Church has implemented are Virtus training, and Background checks for all church employees and volunteers. Virtus training focuses on educating teachers, parents, clergy and other adults who interact with children. Virtus teaches about signs of sexual abuse and provides much information to help prevent such abuse. Background checks: 1) ensure that a person is who they say they are, and 2) helps determine if that individual has a history that would make them unsuitable to work with minors.

The reality is that since the Diocese implemented these new requirements, the incidents of abuse have been almost non-existent. The stories in the newspapers or on television are from cases that have happened 20, 30, 40 or even 50 years ago. So, my point is that, although these older cases have been very damaging and hurtful to everyone involved, once the church took action, things have steadily improved to the point where there have been few, if any new cases, in our diocese in recent years.

In summary, if you read this page carefully, you can see that I am not justifying bad behavior but just pointing out that most of these bad acts happened many years ago. When you read something in the paper or see something on television, please keep in mind that these are not new cases! The church failed prior to 2002, but has done a very good job since 2002 in protecting our children. We, you and I, the active people in today's church, can sometimes become despondent when we read of these (mostly) historic abuses. We always want to be sensitive, and supportive, to those who have been hurt, and the church is constantly working to that end. At the same time, as a church, we need to move forward. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we are cleaning up the sins of the past, and regenerating the pure church that Christ left us with, a church that has been stained by the deeds of a few. Jesus did not come down from heaven to give up, and he doesn't want us to give up either. In fact, he wants us to persevere and live by faith. Here are His last words to us from the Gospel of Matthew, "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

Veni Sancti Spiritus # 7

Devotion to the Holy Spirit is part of what Karl Rahner calls “the economic Trinity,” i.e. the workings of the Trinity in the world to be saved and sanctified. These workings are jointly the work of the “immanent Trinity”, i.e. the Three Divine Persons in their own intimate life. The Trinity is One, and each of the divine Persons is the one God (not participants in the divine nature as we are

participants in human nature). Yet, as they are working (to sustain and sanctify) within the “box” of time and space which is our environment, they accommodate to our understanding in attempting to articulate their creative, saving and sanctifying work in our world, which is their creation. Hence, we ascribe to the Father the works of creation; to the Son the works of salvation; and to the Holy Spirit the works of sanctification. All Three are involved in each category, but through the divine Person named. “In the beginning was the Word...and the Word was God...all came to be through Him.” (Jn.1:1-3). In our devotional life, we may channel our prayer to the Father, but the Son and Spirit are equally recipients of our worship and responsive to our needs. Accommodation to our limits is a potent example of the love and consideration God has for us. The Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed we say at Mass has three sections one for each of the divine Persons, but clearly insists they are three subsistent Relationships, are one God, one divine Nature.

The Incarnation of the Son, in human history, is a critical moment dividing eras in our calendar along the lines of God’s foreknowledge of events. To God the Father is attributed a major role as Creator. With His *sending of the Son*, the birth of Jesus is recorded in the NT along with his actions, teachings, death and resurrection. So critical was that event that the years following are numbered with the designation *AD in anno Domini = in the year of the Lord*. Jesus’ birth is a *Kairos* = an event that having happened continues to be present and effective for all of the ages following. Jesus, upon his return to the Father *sent* the Holy Spirit, at Pentecost, to remain with the Church throughout time to guide, sanctify and enlighten us. It is *these sendings* that recommends our appreciative response of prayer and adoration of the Holy Spirit. Yet the effects of the sendings are very different. The indwelling of the Spirit makes us adopted sons/daughters of Father and heirs to the Kingdom of God. This adoption is totally different from the natural Sonship of Jesus with the Father. Consider Jesus statement to Mary Madeline “I have not yet ascended to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God” (Jn.20:17). The relationship God offers us is totally gratuitous; and when accepted by us with the urging and aid of the Holy Spirit makes us participants of the life of God through his sanctifying grace. As at Pentecost it emboldened the disciples and urged them to face the future with confidence, it does the same for us. “Come Holy Spirit and renew the face of the earth”!

Paraclete is one of the titles of the Holy Spirit. It comes from the Greek ‘para’-‘along side’; and ‘kalein’-‘to call’. In prayer and meditation on the Holy Spirit that is what we are doing, calling the Holy Spirit to mind and resting in His presence with the conviction that He will aid us in resolving whatever issues we are concerned about, and coming to understand more perfectly the plan God has for us along with the that personal decisions and actions we must take to allow God’s plan for us to be realized. Jesus premised: “I will ask the Father, and he will send you another Paraclete to be with you always, the Spirit of truth” (Jn 14: 16-17). Here, the whole Trinity advocates for us - the Father sending, the Son interceding, and the Spirit in constant presence to and for us.

MEN SUFFER TOO

It is not surprising to learn that many women suffer Post Abortion Syndrome. But would it surprise you to learn that men suffer from the syndrome too? Men suffer for their lost fatherhood for any number of reasons: they were powerless to prevent their partner from having the procedure; they actively encouraged their partner to have the abortion; or in a misguided attempt to be supportive, did nothing to dissuade her from undergoing the surgery. But because men and women are, at their core, different (remember the book title, "Men are from Mars, Women are from Venus"?) and because while women are allowed to express their emotions, men are discouraged from doing so, the way that men respond to feelings of grief, guilt, shame, vulnerability, helplessness is often hidden or expressed as anger, aggressiveness or withdrawal (Coyle, 2007).

If you know of a man who has been suffering Post Abortion Syndrome, encourage him to register for the Diocese of Rockville Centre's Evening of Prayer for Men Suffering Abortion Loss on Wednesday, November 13, 2019. The evening consists of Mass, dinner, adoration, and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The evening is free and totally confidential (so confidential that the website does not even disclose the location).

Family Mass August 11



Gospel Meditation

August 18, 2019: 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time- Gospel Meditation

The Prince of Peace wants to set the world on fire? This Sunday's Gospel can sound more intense than what we may be accustomed to. It's a passage of contradictions. Jesus so clearly prays for unity, yet here he speaks of division. Why would our God who comes as an offering of love speak so frankly about causing relationships to be torn apart?

The sobering truth is that Jesus is divisive. We see this throughout the Gospels, as the Pharisees critique him, the Romans condemn him, and not everyone in the crowd is enthusiastic about his words. Jesus has not come for the purpose of dividing, but what he does is so radical that it upends the status quo. And it doesn't end with his preaching and miracles! "There is a baptism with which I must be baptized." Jesus isn't talking about his baptism at the Jordan River, which has already occurred, but the passing through the waters of death on the Cross and rising again to new life in the resurrection. This is divisive stuff! Christ's spiritual fire turned the "fathers" - the Jewish people and Pharisees - against the "sons" - the common people. Not everyone wants the Gospel Jesus is preaching. Not everyone wants to be set on fire with the desire to love others. Some prefer to put on a warm sweater and curl up in front of the TV.

In living and loving as Jesus did, we, too, might ruffle some feathers. In disciplining our teenage child for sneaking out, we may cause some division (temporarily, we hope!). In standing up to gossip and the spread of cruel rumors in our workplace, we might cause division. In emphasizing the dignity of both the desperate mother and the unborn child, we might cause division. Not everyone wants the Gospel Jesus is preaching. Not everyone wants the Gospel we are invited to live. But that's no excuse not to live it.

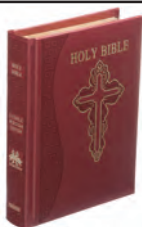
