Celebrating Advent in 2018

The colors of the vestments worn at the liturgical celebrations represented here, all have their own meaning as well as the ability to elicit the spirit of the season in which the liturgical rite is celebrated. We notice that both Advent and Lent signal preparation for something of great religious importance to the Church: Christmas and Easter. These key Feasts deserve a special time for us to be sure that we are prepared, both spiritually and intellectually, to celebrate with deepened faith and conviction both the mystery of the Incarnation, Jesus' birth into our world, and His Resurrection from the dead for our salvation. Historically, these Seasons, Advent and Lent, were of the same length in number of days and intensity of penance to be observed.

The Season, as we experience it now, begins on the Sunday nearest the feast of St. Andrew (Nov. 11th). This year Advent is from Dec. 2nd to Dec. 23rd. The earliest centuries of

Christian history were the era of Martyrs. Christians did not have to be reminded of their religious commitment, it was daily on trial. That frightful time ended with the assumption of Imperial power, East and West, by Constantine (312-337). During his reign and with the Edict of Milan in 313 the Christian faith became not only legal but all religions were free to practice their beliefs. Constantine favored Christianity, his mother Helena was a Christian, he eventually was baptized. Being a Christian seemed to have become the path to preferment in the Empire. This led to a rush to become Christian. By the end of the 4th Century bishops realized the need to establish feasts and liturgies aimed at intensifying the knowledge of and, therefore, the motivation for the faith that seemed to have become more a socio-cultural event than authentic faith. This is what the season of Advent is intended to accomplish for all of us, a time to review and renew our faith. Advent is different from Lent in number of days and in intensity of fasting and abstinence. It is the Spirit of Advent, (signified by its name derived from Latin: "ad = to" and "venire = come"), the coming of Jesus into our lives and history, personal and corporate. To accomplish this we are asked to allow our faith to become intensified to the point that we appreciate more deeply the honor done to and for us in the Incarnation of God's own Son, Jesus Christ. The entrance antiphon for each of the Sunday Masses offers a particular message for the week day Masses to follow. I have space in this bulletin article to select only one for examination, and have chosen that of the third Sunday in Advent: *Gaudete In Domino semper: ... Dominus enim prope est* "Rejoice in the Lord always ... indeed the Lord is near" (Philippians 4:4). The Latin word 'Gaudete' is in the imperative but does not represent a demand from outside of ourselves. Rather, it is an internal urge to be well prepared and accepting of the gracious Gift the Father is giving to us. It is a gift that is already present in, to and an integral part of our lives. Jesus is 'prope = near. That Latin word actually means 'already present, already an intimate part of our very being'. Objectively, Jesus is indwelling within us; subjectively, we have to be accepting of this reality and determined to live as the Tabernacle of the Lord where Jesus wishes to be. Advent is our opportunity to look deeply into ourselves, our moral lives and relationships with one another to see whether we are the fit dwelling places in which Jesus will be comfortable to reside. We live in a very distracting world and cultural environment. It is too easy to get so involved in the plans for the holiday that the purpose for this Holiday becomes secondary or even tertiary. Here are some suggestion for Advent: attend Mass as often as possible, if that is not possible, read the Scriptures for the day; pray the rosary each day; spend at least a half hour reading the Scriptures - John 1: 1-15; Matthew (the Infancy narratives) chapters 1: 1 - 2: 23; Luke 1: 1 - 2: 52.

Pastor's Pen

Advent: Bishop Robert Barron

Every Advent, Christians sing a haunting song whose words go back to the ninth century. But I wonder how carefully we listen to the lyrics:

O come, O come Emmanuel
and ransom captive Israel
that mourns in lonely exile here
Until the Son of God appears.

In the ancient world, people were tremendously afraid of being kidnapped and held for ransom. Alone, far from home, malnourished, often tortured, hostages could only hope against hope that their deliverance might come. This is the situation evoked by that well-known song: Israel, the people of God, are held for ransom in their lonely exile, and they cry out for their savior, the Son of God.

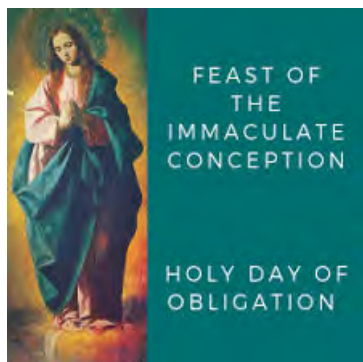
To be caught in the nexus of sin is to know the truth and to feel the texture of this imprisonment. We mourn over the sins and moral failures of our leaders; we feel trapped by our own falls into dysfunction and addiction; we feel overwhelmed by the dark powers of the world.

But the good news of Christianity is that Emmanuel ("God with us") has indeed appeared, and he has gone right to the bottom of sin in order to defeat it. In his full humanity, Jesus entered into that complex web of sin, and in his full divinity, he did something about it.

May we spend these holy days together in prayer, and hope, fixing our eyes on the appearance of Christ our Savior and longing for his deliverance.

The Immaculate Conception

Many people are not sure of the difference between the Incarnation and the Immaculate Conception. The Incarnation is the birth of Jesus Christ. Mary, our Blessed Mother, gave birth to Jesus Christ. The Immaculate Conception is when Mary was conceived by her mother with no stain of sin. It was an "Immaculate" conception: free from original sin! We are all born with original sin, Mary was not. We celebrate this very important Holy Day on December 8th every year.

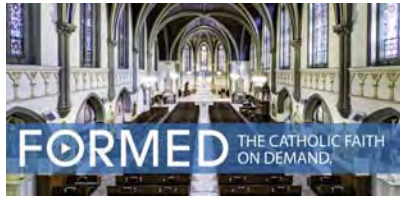

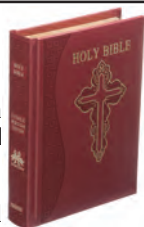
