As Bishop Robert Barron so clearly states in his Lenten Gospel Reflections, “Lent is a time to reflect on the suffering and death of Jesus Christ”. We reflect on his suffering and death in hopes of gaining a better appreciation of how Jesus so willingly suffered for us. We share in his suffering by giving up one, or some, of our daily pleasures, joys or conveniences of life. In making our own personal sacrifice, in a small way, we share in the suffering he experienced for us. The suffering he experienced in his forty days in the desert and his way to the cross. His suffering in his excruciating pain as he hung from the cross.

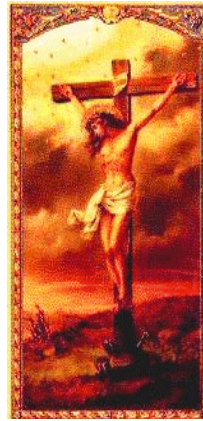

# Message from Deacon Lachlan Cameron

**“Each year, on the occasion of Lent, the Church invites us to a sincere review of our life in light of the teachings of the Gospel” ..... Pope Benedict Lenten message 2010.**

Another Lent is upon us. For many of us it has become like our New Year resolution.....at New Year we pick something in our lifestyle that we feel we need to change....and then, after a short time....we tail off....and we are back where we started. So too with Lent. Very often we try to make a ‘good Lent’ by giving up something we enjoy...or we try to make some sacrifice, because that’s what we do in Lent...right? We try to follow the teachings of the Church, which encourage us, in a particular way during Lent, to focus on prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Sometimes easier said than done.....especially the fasting!

For almost a year now we have been living through what seems like one long Lent. Without exception we have all had to give up something....we have all had to make sacrifices. We have been confined to our homes....many are working from home....sometimes our children are being schooled at home. We are unable, for the most part, to visit our families and friends, or take vacations. Our ability to worship in our usual manner has been compromised. Many have been ill, and some have, sadly, passed away during these very difficult times. Our lives have been turned upside down, because of the dangers created by Covid 19. We are making involuntary changes to our regular lifestyle because it is necessary..... if we are to put the dangers of this virus behind us. We all want to see the end of it. We are..... each of us....doing what we have to do....so that this will come to an end. We’ve had enough!

Lenten sacrifices, however, are very different than coronavirus sacrifices. The whole purpose of our Lenten practices are not to put up with them for 6 weeks.... ‘I can’t wait to have a ...’ (fill in the blank). It’s not about putting up with a sacrifice or giving up some favorite thing we enjoy.....and then being happy when the 6 weeks is over. No! Lent is about drawing closer to God...about strengthening our relationship with Jesus Christ. Unlike the lockdown sacrifices we have all been making.....lockdown sacrifices which are a means to an end.....the end of a virus.....our Lenten sacrifice is an opportunity to begin....to begin anew something which has perhaps been pushed aside....perhaps, in some cases, has fallen away completely. Lent is our chance to look at where we are in our relationship with God. It’s our opportunity to put things right with God, and to build and renew a spiritual life which will nourish and sustain us during our journey here on earth.

Today is sometimes called Quinquagesima Sunday....from today it is 50 days to Easter Sunday. It is also of course the Sunday before Ash Wednesday. At the top of this page there is a quote from Pope Benedict. He tells us that each Lent we are called to make a ‘sincere review of our life in light of the teachings of the Gospel’. This has been a tough year for everyone, and for those who have lost a loved one, it has been particularly bad. Despite these difficulties, perhaps we can put in the work to make this Lent our best ever. Maybe we can use this time to take on board the wisdom of Pope Benedict and reflect on our life.... and see if we can conform it with the teachings of Christ in the Gospel. Rather than counting the days till Lent is over..... we’ve all done that at some time.....perhaps we can work on growing closer to Jesus.....and be grateful that these days of Lent have been set aside for us.....to do just that.

May Almighty God bless us, protect us from all evil, and lead us into everlasting life. Amen

# Reflection

## Sunday, February 14, 2021

(Lec. 77)

- 1) Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46
- 2) 1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1
- 3) Mark 1:40-45

FOCUS: Let us turn to Christ today to heal our wounds.

Jesus enters into our spiritual and physical suffering with his mercy to heal our separation from God and draw us back into the relationship for which we are made. The leper's faith can lead us also to confidently seek Christ out today. Jesus, the eternal Word of God, draws near to us to heal us of every wound.

### LITURGY OF THE WORD

The Lord gives instructions to Moses and Aaron for how to deal with leprosy. In the second reading, Paul encourages the Corinthians to do everything for the glory of God. In the Gospel, a leper asks Jesus to make him clean, and after he is made so, he then begins *to publicize the whole matter*.



# Respect Life Committee

## RESPECT LIFE COMMITTEE

February is African American History Month, a time to honor the African Americans who overcame adversity and made great contributions to United States history. I would like to honor one such African American hero of the Right to Life movement.

**Alveda King**, writer, civil rights advocate, former Georgia state representative, minister of the Gospel, mother of six, and grandmother, is the niece of Dr. Martin Luther King and the daughter of the Rev. A. D. King, also a prominent leader in the civil rights movement. At present she is Director of **Civil Rights for the Unborn** and Director of African American Outreach of **Silent No More**, a ministry of **Priests for Life**, to help women who have had abortions heal from the trauma and regret they have suffered. Having had two abortions herself before she became a “born again” Christian, she has “walked the walk so she can talk the talk.”

An articulate, dynamic speaker in preaching the **Gospel of Life**, Dr. King does not mince words when speaking about abortion. She says: “Abortion and racism are both symptoms of a fundamental human error. The error is thinking that when someone stands in the way of our wants, we can justify getting that person out of our lives. Abortion and racism stem from the same poisonous root, selfishness.

She also adds: “A majority, perhaps as many as 75 percent, of abortion clinics are in areas with high minority populations. Abortion apologists will say this is because they want to serve the poor. You don't serve the poor, however, by taking their money to terminate their children.”

“The great irony is that abortion has done what the Klan only dreamed of...Roughly 1/4 of the black population is missing.”

Alveda King often quotes her uncle, “How can the ‘dream’ survive if we murder the children? Every aborted baby is like a slave of his or her mother. The mother decides his or her fate.” “Life from the womb to the tomb....Everybody is important.”

A deeply religious woman, she says that with the help of God she hopes to achieve her goal to reach African Americans as well as the general population with the truth about the harmful impact of abortion, and to end the terrible scourge of abortion. May God prosper her work!

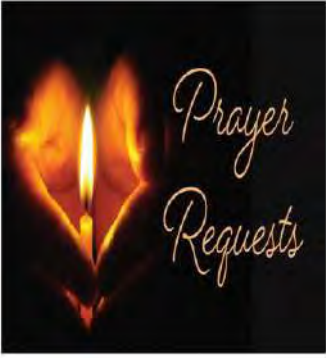

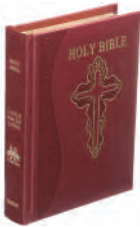
