Below is a continuation of the pastoral letter “**Bringing Christ to Campus**” by Most Rev. John O. Barres, Bishop of Rockville Centre. Last week we printed the fifth point. Here is the sixth point:

6) **Sanctify your daily academic work.** As you sit down for a three-hour study block of biology, engineering, mathematics, accounting, literature, art history or theatre, begin with a short prayer that offers God your academic concentration, determination and tenacity and transforms the study into prayer and a practice of the presence of God.

Be a Renaissance person who is able to integrate step-by-step the history of music, art, cinema and literature as you study engineering, accounting, journalism, education, history or some other dimension of liberal arts. A Renaissance person grounded in the truths, mission and mysticism of his or her Catholic faith can cast a wider net of mission and evangelization because of a capacity to engage in a wide range of conversations with a wide range of people.

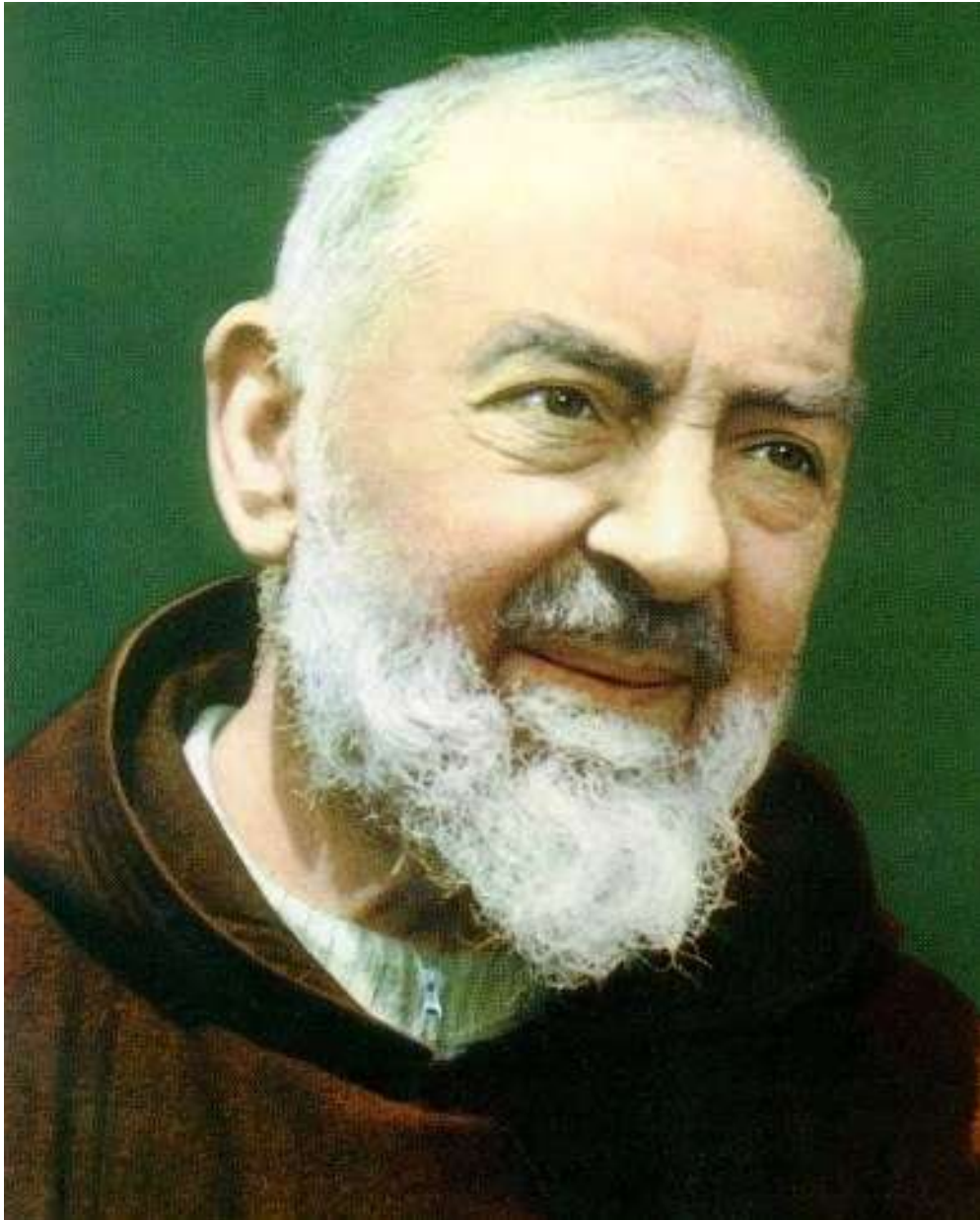

St. Pius of Pietrelcina

(probably better known to most of us as Padre Pio)



Next Friday, September 23rd is the Feast Day of Padre Pio...or to give him his new name since his canonization, Saint Pius of Pietrelcina. Born Francesco Forgione, he was a Franciscan Capuchin priest, stigmatist and mystic.

He overcame many difficulties in his life to become one of the great Saints of the twentieth century. He was canonized on June 16th 2002 by Pope John Paul II in St. Peter's Square in Vatican City.

25TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

1) Amos 8:4-7 2) 1 Timothy 2:1-8

3) Luke 16:1-13 or 16:10-13 **FOCUS:** The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones. Loving God and neighbor are the highest priorities for Christians. The prophets challenged the Israelites when their love of wealth led to neglecting God, and warned them against treating others unjustly and dishonestly. Jesus reinforces the message: Our relationship with God requires a commitment to a higher calling by remaining true to him and treating others with honesty, generosity and justice.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

In the first reading, Amos warns those who trample upon the needy that the Lord will not forget the way they have treated the poor. In the second reading, Saint Paul advises Timothy to pray for everyone, including those in authority. In the Gospel, Jesus uses the parable of the dishonest steward to teach his disciples about trustworthiness.
